LIC Board approved proposal to buy 51% stake in IDBI bank

- The board of Life Insurance Corporation of India approved a proposal to buy up to 51 percent stake in IDBI Bank Ltd.
- The government-owned lender IDBI is in need of capital so the preferred option for the IDBI was to issue preferential shares.
- The government's stake at presently is 86 percent and after the stake purchase it will come down below 50 percent.

The board of the Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India has already permitted LIC to increase its stake from 10.82 percent to 51 percent in IDBI Bank. The proposed deal will also need a nod from the Government and the Reserve Bank of India.

Preference shares, also referred as preferred stock - are shares of a company's stock with dividends that are paid out to shareholders before common stock dividends are issued.

• To benefit more people from the scheme, the minimum yearly deposit required under the popular girl child savings scheme, Sukanya Samriddhi Yojana, has been lowered to Rs 250 from Rs 1,000 earlier. The government has amended the Sukanya Samriddhi Account Rules, 2016.

Under the 'Beti Bachao Beti Padhao' initiative, the Sukanya Samriddhi account was launched in January 2015.

The interest rate on the Sukanya Samriddhi account is revised every quarter, just like other small savings schemes and the Public Provident Fund.



International

The 8th India-Oman Joint Commission meeting was held in Muscat. The areas of
discussion in the Joint Commission Meeting included cooperation in the area of
space, renewable energy, start-ups, SMEs, food security including durable food and
packaging, services sector, tourism sector, exchange of ideas and visit of young
entrepreneurs.

Both India and Oman are keen to expand collaborations to their mutual benefit in the fields of energy, health, business, finance and investments, infrastructure, travel and tourism.

• Hungary will quit a U.N. migration pact before its final approval -calling the agreement a "threat to the world".

The Global Compact for Safe, Orderly and Regular Migration was approved on Friday by all 193 U.N. member nations except the United States.

• The Peruvian government declared a state of emergency for the village of Llusco in the southern department of Cusco, it happened after a landslide devastated homes, fields and highways.

According to the government report, the state of emergency lasted 60 days, with the aim of bringing aid to the hundreds of displace.

The centre of Operations for Regional Emergencies declared that "there has been no personal damages, however, a number of homes were flattened."

• The European Union and Japan signed a huge free trade deal that cuts or eliminates tariffs on nearly all goods, which covers 600 million people and almost a third of the global economy. It will remove tariffs on European exports such as cheese and wine.

Japanese automakers and electronics firms will face fewer barriers in the European Union.

It's a major endorsement of a global trading system that is under increasing threat from protectionism.



Japan and the European Union traded roughly €129 billion (\$152 billion) of goods last year.

• Turkey's state of emergency imposed after the failed 2016 coup is lifted.

President Recep Tayyip Erdogan declared the state of emergency on July 20, 2016, five days after warplanes bombed Ankara and bloody clashes broke out in Istanbul in a doomed putsch bid that claimed 249 lives.

• The 3rd BRICS Media Forum held on July 18-19 in Cape Town, South Africa.

The theme of BRICS Media Cooperation – "Fostering an Inclusive, Just World Order"

This media forum formed part of the upcoming 10th BRICS summit to be held on July 25-27 in Johannesburg, South Africa, which assumes the rotational chairmanship of BRICS in 2018.

- The 6th meeting of India-Nepal Oversight Mechanism reviewed the progress of the implementation of all bilateral projects since the reciprocal state visits by prime ministers, meeting was co-chaired by Manjeev Singh Puri, Ambassador of India to Nepal and Shanker Das Bairagi, Foreign Secretary, Government of Nepal.
- Projects included Cross-border rail projects, Integrated Check Posts, Tarai Roads Project, Cross-border transmission lines, Arun-III Hydropower Project.
 - An Indian Army team has reached Moscow to participate in the International Army games scheduled from July 28 to August 11. India participated in two competitions including the Tank Biathlon and Elbrus Ring.

The Army games are organised annually by Russia and this year 28 competitions held in seven countries including Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belarus, China, Iran and Kazakhstan and Russia.

- The 4th edition of Bay of Bengal Initiatives for Multi-Sectoral, Technical and Economic Cooperation held in Kathmandu from 30-31st August.
- Nepal is the current chair of BIMSTEC.
- The main focus of summit: To increase connectivity between BIMSTEC Nations including roads, railways and transmission lines.



• Myanmar has joined International Solar Alliance and become its 68th member.

Group is aiming at optimum utilisation of solar energy.

According to National Intelligence Council US report "Global Trends 2030:
 Alternative Worlds", China's economy supposed to surpass the United States in less than two decades while Asia will overtake North America and Europe combined in global power by 2030.

As the world's largest economic power, China is expected to remain ahead of India, but the gap could begin to close by 2030 – as per strategic thinking in the report.

Assam's anti-witch hunting bill got President nod

 President Ram Nath Kovind has approved the Assam Witch Hunting (Prohibition, Prevention and Protection) Bill, 2015 - converting it to an Act. It is a move towards creating a just and equitable society.

The bill has been converted into an Act after almost three years it was passed by Assam's state assembly.

The Assam Assembly had unanimously passed this Bill on August 13, 2015 which imposes imprisonment of up to seven years along with a fine of up to Rs5 lakh for branding someone as witch.

Govt. to hand-deliver 11 crore Ayushman Cards

- The government will print and hand-deliver about 110 million 'family cards' for the Ayushman Bharat health insurance scheme in a major public contact programme by organising 'Ayushman Pakhwaras' in villages.
- The Central government will also set up a 24X7 call centre in the capital to attend to complaints and queries from citizens about the scheme and assist them when they are outside their home states.

Lok Sabha passed Fugitive Economic Offenders Bill

• Lok Sabha passed Fugitive Economic Offenders bill aimed at preventing culprits from evading the legal process and fleeing the country.

This comes after the Mallya, Nirav Modi, Choksi scams and increasing NPA in the nation.

UGC formed panel to recommend exam reforms in higher education institutions

• The University Grants Commission (UGC) has formed a committee under the chairmanship of M M Salunkhe to suggest examination reforms in institutions of higher learning. The panel has been asked to submit its report by October, 2018.

Shri J.P. Nadda addressed 8th BRICS Health Ministers Meeting at Durban

• Shri J P Nadda, Union Minister of Health and Family Welfare addressed the '8th BRICS Health Ministers' Meeting at Durban, South Africa. He proposed India is



more firmly committed to achieve Universal Health Coverage (UHC) as articulated in its National Health Policy.

India is committed to eliminate TB by 2025.

• UK has topped an annual global ranking of nations' soft power followed by France on the list of 30 countries which does not feature India.

India did not figure on the list, but this year's report also features a chapter dedicated solely to Asia, listing 10 countries in the region, ranking India's soft power as eighth

Asian countries are translating economic development into soft power gains over the medium term, with improved aggregate rankings for China, Japan, South Korea, and Singapore from 2015 to 2018.



'Soft Power 30' index published by UK-based strategic communications consultancy firm Portland and the University of Southern California Center on Public Diplomacy.

- IT Madras has launched "world's first" remotely operatable microscope developed at a cost of Rs 40 crore that would enable a precise atom-by-atom view of a material "Local Electrode Atom Probe (LEAP)".
- It was developed in a collaborative exercise involving eight top research institutions headed by IIT Madras.
- The microscope enabled a true three-dimensional (3D) atomic scale reconstruction which would impart a major thrust to research in nanotechnology
- The partnering institutions in the collaborative included IITs of Bombay, Delhi, Kanpur, Kharagpur and Ropar along with International Advanced Research Centre for Powder Metallurgy and New Materials (ARCI).
 - Indian Railways signed an agreement with the Maharashtra Metro Railway Corporation (MahaMetro) to create a mass rapid transit system in the city. Under the MoU, the Railways and MahaMetro would work towards linking railway line to metro coaches on broad gauge network and creating a mass rapid transit system in Nagpur.

This would cut the cost of fuel usage worth Rs 12,000-15,000 crore.

- India ranked 109th in the list of 124 countries in average download speed on 4G connections.
- The average download speed on 4G connections in India is less than that of neighbouring countries like Pakistan, Myanmar, and Sri Lanka.
- According to a report, the average 4G LTE data speed in India has remained constant for more than a year at about 6.1Mbps, much less than the global average of about 17Mbps.

According to Ookla report, the growth of smartphone users and an increase in the number of mobile internet users in India could be one of the reasons for the slow internet connection in India.

• Puducherry Tourism has announced the inaugural edition of an independent film extravaganza – Pondicherry International Film Festival.



- Festival which will showcase over 100 films from more than 25 countries.
- The inaugural edition of PIFF will be held from September 26 to 30.

France is the partner country for the festival and there will be a special focus on French cinema, art and culture.

PIFF 2018 would have a special section on independent Tamil cinema and will also focus on independent regional cinema.

 Mandela Day was celebrated on 18 July - annual international day adopted by United Nations.

This year marks 100 years since the birth of Nelson Mandela.

- Noted Lyricist and poet Gopaldas Neeraj passed away at age of 93 because of ailing Lung Infection
- He has been awarded both Padma Shri and Padma Bhushan in 1991 and 2007 respectively.
 - The most recent age in Earth's 4.54 billion year history began 4,200 years ago which has been officially designated as the Meghalayan Age, proposed after the Indian state.

It is the first formal geological subdivision of the Holocene epoch that began 11,600 years ago and extends to the present, into three ages: Greenlandian, Northgrippian and Meghalayan.

Study of stalagmite found in Mawmluh cave in Meghalaya highlighted this chemical preservation of the transition in ages.

• The Indian Air Force (IAF) is participating in the multinational "Pitch Black" warfare exercise in Australia held from 24 July – August 18, hosted by the Royal Australian Air Force (RAAF).

The IAF contingent will consist of 145 air-warriors including Garud team, four Su-30MKI fighters, one C-130 special operations aircraft and one C-17 transporter.

It will see eight other nations participating with over 100 aircraft.



• Forbes has named Hollywood actor Dwayne 'The Rock' Johnson the highest paid actor in the world, earning at \$124 million last year was the largest ever recorded on the Forbes celebrity list. He earned double the money he earned in 2017.

His movie 'Skyscraper' is out in cinemas in the UK, and other than films he also has HBO series 'Ballers' coming up.

• Google announced a smaller event – Android Dev Summit to be held on 7-8 November in Mountain view, California, event is focussed on developers.

Last such event was held in 2015 at same venue - Mountain View, California.

• India Heritage Walk Festival – a collaboration of Sahapedia and YES Arts & Culture has been awarded the PATA Gold Award 2018 under Heritage – Culture Category.

Sahapedia had organised IHWF 2018 to encourage citizens to explore the tangible and intangible heritage of their cities and towns.

- Former and first finance minister of chattisgarh Ramchandra Singh Deo passed away at the age of 88.
- NABARD has launched a centre for accelerating concerted action on climate change by various stakeholders including government, private and financial sectors at Lucknow.

It will extend professional support to stakeholders for designing climate related projects and take up collaborative studies and action research projects in area of climate change.

• The National Council of Educational Research and Training (NCERT) has initiated the process of introducing QR code in their textbooks.



- This move is aimed at helping students understand chapters better by watching a film or reading additional content on laptops and digital boards.
 - Facebook is working on launching its own satellite "Athena" in early 2019. The project is designed to "efficiently provide broadband access to unserved and underserved areas throughout the world
 - Indian Border Roads Organisation has completed construction of a strategically key road in Bhutan which is linking the neighbouring country's border town of Phuentshogling with the capital city of Bhutan Thimpu.
- 30Km long Damku Chukha road has been constructed at the cost of Rs287 crore under India assisted development projects in the Himalayan Nation.

- Nozomi Okuhara of Japan defeated Indian star shuttler PV Sindhu by 15-21, 18-21 to lift the title at the Nimibutr Stadium in Bangkok.
- Wrestler Federation of India President Brij Bhushan is set to be named as Chef de Mission of the Asian Games bound Indian contingent.

The four deputy Chefs de Mission set to be appointed are BS Kushwaha (former secretary of Indian Kayaking and Canoeing Federation), RK Sacheti (Executive Director of Boxing Federation of India), DK Singh (Uttarakhand Olympic Association) and Colonel RK Swain (Secretary of Equestrian Federation of India).

- Neeraj Chopra, India's javelin star, struck Gold in the Meeting International de Sotteville-les-Rouen in France. He threw 85.17 metres to bag the top prize.
- The second best was Adrian Mardare of Moldova who threw a distance of 81.48 m.
- The bronze medal went to Edis Matusevicius of Lithuania whose best was 79.31 m.
 - Mansi settled for silver in women's free style wrestling at Junior Asian championship in New Delhi after loosing to Akie Hanai.

Swati won Bronze after defeating Thailand's Duangnapa Boonyasu.

• Brazil goalkeeper Alisson became the world's most expensive goalkeeper replacing Loris Karius after joining Liverpool from Roma, for \$84.5 million.

Virgil van Dijk became the world's most expensive defender when he joined Liverpool from Southampton for \$99 million in January.

- Indian badminton player Lakshaya Sen clinched the gold medal after defeating Indonesia's Kunlavut Vitidsaran in the final match of the Badminton Asia Junior Championship with 21-19, 21-18.
- Muhammed Anas Yahiya entered the record books when he broke his own national record of 45.31 seconds with 45.24 seconds to win the 400 metres race at the Cena Noveho Mesta nad Metuji meet in Czech Republic.



• Captain Sunil Chhetri named as the 2017 All India Football Federation (AIFF) player of the year award and became the 2nd Indian footballer to play 100 International games after Bhaichung Bhutia.

India's supersonic cruise missile BrahMos test fired

- India's supersonic cruise missile BrahMos was test fired from the Integrated Test Range (ITR) at Chandipur.
- The test firing of BrahMos was conducted from a Static Inclined LauncherBrahMos.
- This can be used against targets in mountains and also against aircraft carriers

NASA set to launch world's first mission to touch the sun

- NASA to launch mankind's first mission to the Sun a car sized probe that will swoop to within 4 million miles of the solar surface
- The name of probe is Parker Solar Probe.
- It is expected to take off after August 6 abroad United Launch Alliance Delta IV Heavy.
- Probe will explore the corona, a region of the Sun only seen from Earth when the Moon blocks out the Sun's bright face during total solar eclipses.

NASA launched online toolkit to promote commercial use of satellite data

- NASA has launched an online toolkit to make it easier for users to find, analyse and
 utilise the most relevant satellite data for their research, business projects or
 conservation efforts.
- The "Remote Sensing Toolkit" provides a simple system that quickly identifies relevant sources based on user input.



State

- Gujarat state government has decided to form the Sanskrit Bhasha Vikas Board to promote the Sanskrit language.
- Haryana CM Manohar Lal Khattar launched the 'Paudhagiri' campaign by planting a 'maulsari' sapling in the Tau Devi Lal Sports Complex premises of Gurgaon. The campaign is aimed at increasing the green cover in the state.

Under this campaign, 22 lakh students from class 6 to 12 of all government and private schools in Haryana will plant a sapling each during three months of monsoon -- July, August and September

- Tamil Nadu govt. for the first time in India has set up a 24 hours toll free line 14417 for education queries to students with an objective to provide information on education and guidance to students.
- Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister launched e-Pragati platform, a digital program, for the governance of the state to digitalise the state and bring transparency in governance.
- Odisha will host India's first private sector triennial in Dec Jan, which will see convergence of artists from the national and international scene during 40 day mega event in Bhubaneswar, Puri and Konark.
- It is named as Odisha Triennial of Art (OTIA) headed by Sashanka Mohapatra.
- Slogan of triennial is "Conceive contemplate communicate".
 - The Bihar Government unanimously passed an amendment law on liquor prohibition in the monsoon session of the state assembly.
